conscious exploration of the shadows within that one can attain genuine enlightenment, transcending illusions and embracing the entirety of their being.

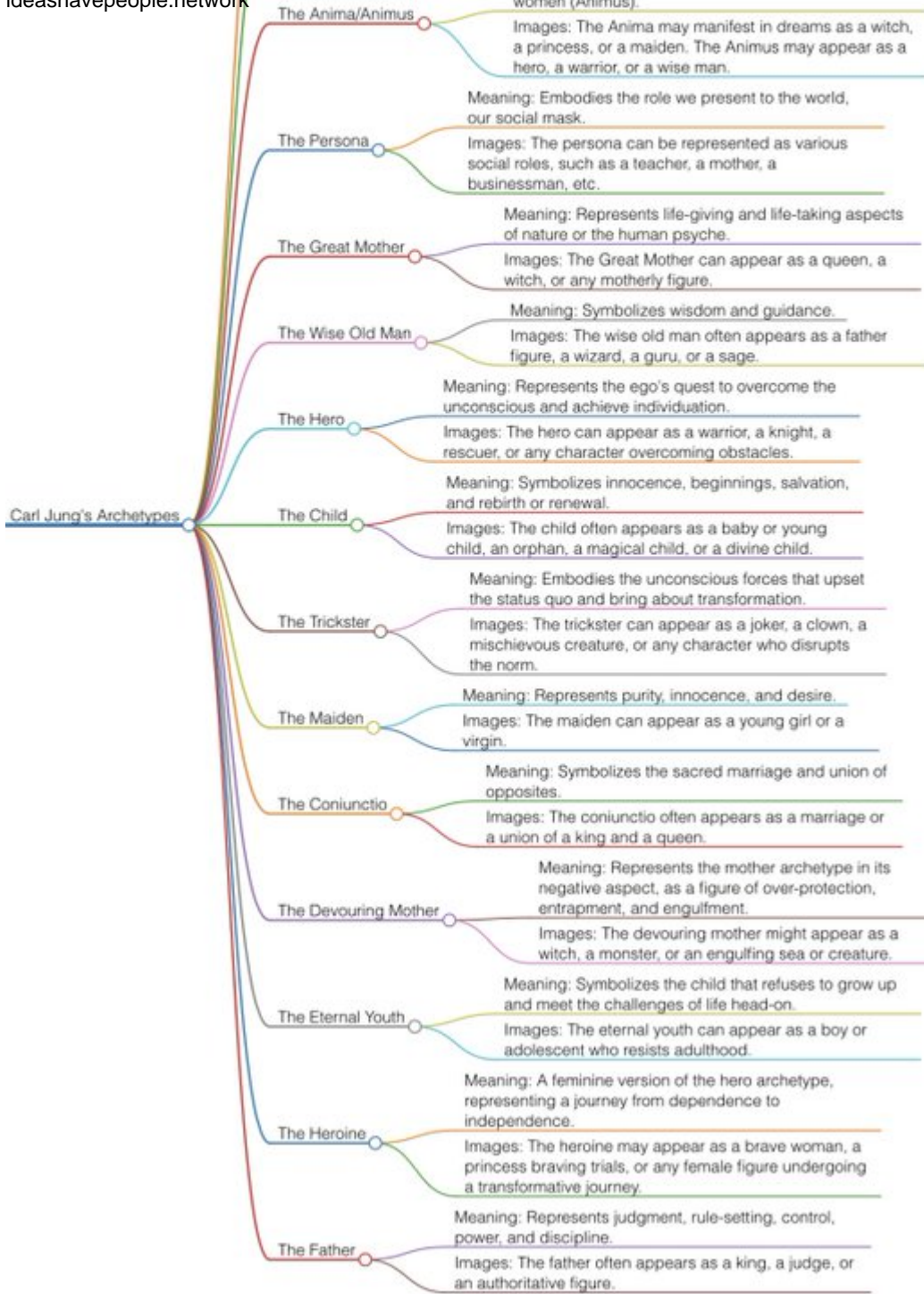
